Local Vet Nurse Fundraising

auren is 26 years old and was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis in December 2015.

Lauren was studying full-time at Massey University. The diagnosis made her reassess what she was doing and made the decision to start studying to be a Veterinary Nurse.

At the beginning of 2019 she qualified and was rewarded with a full-time position at a local Vet Practice.

Having MS along with a full time job, Lauren has no energy for anything else except looking after her dog and her two rabbits.

Lauren's DREAM is to work with animal

charities around the world caring for stray and sick animals.

However, she lives daily with constant nerve pain, spasms, loss of feeling in arms, legs and chronic fatigue.

MS can affect people in different ways - hand-eye coordination, sight, muscle weakness, balance, nerve pain, spasms, loss of feeling in limbs and chronic fatigue. These occur when the brain has trouble sending signals to the nerves and muscles.

Everyday Lauren takes a cocktail of medication. She also gets an infusion of a specialised drug every 5 weeks to help slow down the progression of her MS.

This drug (Tysabri) can lead to complications including a viral

infection of the brain called PML.

Autologous haematopoietic stem cell transplantation (AHSCT) is

an intense chemotherapy treatment for MS. It aims to stop the damage MS causes by wiping out then re-growing your immune system, using your own stem cells.

This isn't funded in New Zealand. Many people from New Zealand have already undergone treatment abroad. Moscow is one of the centres that has pioneered the treatment, successfully treating patients for many years.

This costs a lot of money – treatment costs, travel and accommodation costs. The recovery period is at

least 3 months.

We have been fundraising since January with pop up shops and sausage sizzles.



Torbay Historical Society

he first Primary school in this area was at Long Bay, in 1888. The school was relocated in Deep Creek Road in 1940 - then to Browns Bay and renamed. We have written about this in previous Newsletters. But what about the history of the present Primary Schools in this area?

Torbay School, in Deep Creek Road opened in 1956. with 216 pupils. The people of Torbay wanted to name the School 'Deep Creek School' but the Education Board had already entered the name 'Torbay School' in its records. The first Headmaster was Mr. R. Kirton. The school was officially opened 14 months later, the delay having been because of the tardiness of the necessary work on the playground. On the 4th. May 1957 the then Minister of Education, Mr. Algie officially opened the school. He safely navigated the newly-sealed driveway, known then on as' Algie's Walk'. The swimming pool was built in 1965. By 1975 the roll had reached 920.

Glamorgan School first functioned as a 'side school' to Torbay under the supervision of Bob Baird, Deputy Headmaster of Torbay School. On 2nd. August the first teachers and pupils came from Torbay School to occupy the first 3 available classrooms. The land had originally belonged to Dr. Maurice Greville. The school was officially opened February 1973 with the Headmaster John Hare. He remembers when the school was so remote the postman was not obliged to deliver mail so far up Glamorgan Drive.

Before Glamorgan reached its maximum roll, Long Bay Primary School was being built, - but opening held up because of controversy of access. The school opened in 1979.

We hope that the schools are keeping their History in their archives.

Method

Heat a knob of butter and ½ tbsp oil in a large frying pan, cook onion for 8-10 mins until softened and starting to caramelise.

beans, 500ml chicken stock, 2 tsp mustard and chopped parsley. Add pinch salt and good shake of pepper.

Give it a good stir. Cook on high for 4 hours. The smell while cooking will have you salivating!



Included in our previous trip was a visit to the extensive greenhouses of a commercial grower who described how indoor plants such as philodendron, ficus and anthurium are growing in popularity. It has been commented that with increasing apartment living, people are nurturing their pot plants as substitutes for pets. In April we visit two of Auckland's historic homes and gardens – Alberton and Highwic, where we step back in "garden time" and learn more about this era of Auckland's heritage.





In the garden in April

Prune and tidy daylilies, daisies, lavender, phlox and other perennials that have finished flowering. Take pre-chilled bulbs out of fridge (eg. daffodil, tulip and hyacinth) and plant out in pots or garden beds. Plant the rest of your spring-flowering bulbs. Bulbs that have the best chance of success in warm climates are freesias, jonguils, ixias and babianas. Feed established shrubs and trees. Mix compost or old manure into the soil to get it ready for new roses. If soil is acid, add some lime. Feed lawns with a good quality lawn food and water well to carry the fertiliser down to the roots. April is one of the best months to plant trees and shrubs. Cut back geraniums with spotty, diseased leaves. Prepare for winter vegetables by digging in a good layering of compost.

lt's been а fantastic athletics season for Year 11 student Nadia Evans who has become a National sprint champion.

She won the U18 100 metre and

200 metre events at the New Zealand Track and Field Championships in Christchurch last month where she sliced almost a full second off her 200m time, achieving a new personal best. She also anchored the Auckland U18 4 x 100m relay team to win gold and set a new Auckland Athletics record. In addition, while representing Long Bay College, Nadia set a new College Sport Auckland record at the Northern Zone Athletics Day for the 200m. Her incredible success comes

on the back of a difficult 2019 season when Nadia suffered growth related injuries that forced her out of training and off the track.

She has always had an enormous passion for her sport and was delighted at age eight to meet her idol, legendary sprinter Usain Bolt. She was selected to represent Long Bay College and New Zealand in the secondary schools' team competing in Sydney at the Australian Championships but this event has now been cancelled due to COVID-19. What is COVID-19?


