Erica & Alexis raise funds for North Harbour Community Patrol

On 14 March, Erica & Alexis will be jumping in the Murrays Bay Wharf Birdman event for the NHCP team



Alongside Police, North Harbour Community Patrol (NHCP) play a vital role in the prevention of crime on the North Shore.

Last year Erica Stanford (MP for East Coast Bays) and Alexis Poppelbaum (Hibiscus and Bays Local Board) joined the NHCP team of 35 local volunteers who give their time to help keep our community safe.

Funds are tight – as a charitable trust, NHCP relies entirely on grants and the generosity of the community to keep the patrol car running.

Erica and Alexis recognise the amazing and important job NHCP do and want to support them with funding so they can stay on the road and purchase a second patrol car.

On 14 March, Erica and Alexis will be jumping in the Murrays Bay Wharf Birdman event for the NHCP team.

They are asking the community to sponsor their jump and support the incredible work of NHCP.

NHCP are the 'eyes and ears' for the Police in our community. Three nights a week, they receive direction from the Police on particular suburbs and hot-spots to patrol.

The North Shore is a massive area to cover - there are 37 suburbs from Okura to Northcote and out to Beach Haven and Albany. There are many business districts and hot-spots to cover in one night.

It is a huge challenge for NHCP to effectively patrol the large North

Shore region with just one patrol vehicle. With a second vehicle, volunteers can cover larger areas and provide greater assistance to the Police.

Erica and Alexis have set a goal to raise \$15,000 to support NHCP and contribute toward buying a second patrol car.

They would greatly appreciate the communities support in getting to their goal - even just a few dollars can go a long way.

In the meantime, they are busy building their NHCP birdman car and looking forward to the big event on 14 March!

Ingredients

6 egg whites

2 cups castor sugar

1 tsp vanilla essence

1 tsp white vinegar

2 tsp cornflour

300ml cream, whipped

fresh fruit for decoration

Pre-heat oven to 110°C bake (not fan bake). Line a baking tray with baking paper.

Beat the egg whites until soft peaks form

Continue beating while adding the sugar a quarter of a cup at a time. The mixture should get glossier and thicker with each addition and this should take at least 10 minutes. Beat in the vanilla, vinegar and cornflour. The essential thing is to beat for 10 minutes, this guarantees the success.

How to make the perfect Pavlova

Bake for approximately 1½ hours, until dry and crisp and it lifts easily off the baking paper. Turn the oven off and leave the pavlova for at least an hour before removing from the oven. Finish cooling on a wire rack.

Whip cream until it forms soft peak and spoon on. Decorate with fresh fruit. For a fabulous taste and finish spoon passion fruit juice over the whole lot.

The egg yolks can be stored in the fridge and used another day to make "proper" custard for a dessert.

n 28th of November 2019, the Environment Select Committee (ESC) arrived at Long Bay Primary School. The reason was to hear the Tangaroa Taniwha oral submission to have Waiake Beach and Winstones Cove included in the Okura Marine Reserve.

The process was hard and long, they did well to get this far. The students of Long Bay Primary got petition signatures from people at local supermarkets, nearby schools and they ran an online petition through the Parliament website. They interviewed politicians and Alex Rogers and Miss Moana Tamariki Pohe of the Hauraki Gulf Forum. Ryan Thach, Emily Frear, Carys Archer and Eryn Oelofse were subsequently invited to speak at

the Hauraki Gulf Forum as part of the Forum's youth voice. Just recently the LBP students Ryan Thach, Eryn Oelofse and Sienna Ephraims went to a youth panel located in Takapuna.

The ESC included Members of Parliament from three different political parties, Erica Stanford, Marja Lubeck and Chloe Swarbrick. Six students of LBP - Sophie Keoghan, Cameron Beattie, Dominic Fisher, Angelacoco Li, Aliya Porter and Harlen Pirret presented the oral submission to the committee. They talked to the ESC about the bad things happening in local waters. The ESC asked questions and the LBP students responded confidently and with passion.

LBP Principal Linda Barton, told the ESC that when she was young she lived near Waiake Beach. It was full of life and how it rapidly decreased as she grew older. LBP student Dominic Fisher stated there were more than 10,000 times the safety count of e coli in the waters of Browns Bay Beach and that affects our Waiake Beach Waterwise program through cancellations due to pollution. Politician, Erica Stanford, corrected his data and told him that there was actually more than 5,000,000 times the safety count of e coli and was upset by the loss of opportunities for the tamariki of her old school.

After they talked with Erica Stanford, Marja Lubeck and Chloe Swarbrick, a person named Erin from the Parliamentary Education Team taught the children about how parliament works.

Long Bay Primary became an official extension of Parliament, the first time ever that this has happened in the history of Aotearoa New Zealand. All of the hard work the Tangaroa Taniwha have put into the petition might finally come to a close. The only thing Tangaroa Taniwha can now do is wait for the results of the politicians' answers.

Personally, I feel proud of my contribution to this experience, it has been the first time I've ever done something as big as this. I have learned lots of things from petitions, from interviewing politicians, to how petitions works and how to speak in public. It is pretty sad that it is finally coming to a close but I have to hope that the Tangaroa Taniwha petition to have Waiake Beach included in the Okura Marine Reserve will finally be approved.

Vagabond Feature Film

Rera Wong, formerly of Torbay, gathered a group of filmmaker friends to help her make a micro-budget independent film, Vagabond, back in 2015. This was her first time writing and directing, and she drew on the community around her to make it happen. Key scenes were filmed in the Brownzy Bar, the Torbay Community Hall and further afield, in Whangaparaoa, The Waitakere Ranges and The Honey Centre outside Warkworth. The community was open and welcoming, eager to support emerging talent.



Kera reflects on her film and why she made such a bold choice to put it together with no experience behind her:

"Although I had always considered myself a writer, I had never written anything before Vagabond. Like many people my generation and prior I was afraid to push boundaries, fearing criticism or failure. What could I possibly offer the world that nobody had seen before? Then I realised that the only person that could see through my eyes was me, and this was a X

story that was bursting to be told, and I don't regret that I have taken the risk.

Vagabond is an emotional and deeply relatable story that addresses the pains and traumas occurring in our everyday lives that most of us prefer locked away inside. It is a moving journey that will turn any emotional cynic into a believer of second chances.

I have always thought that one needed to write something utterly and ridiculously amazing to be taken seriously, but Vagabond has taught me that the best

writing comes from the inside, and it is irrelevant what anyone else thinks. It is a project that has completely changed my life, and I hope that for those who see it, it will have a positive effect on their lives too."

Kera is now a successful food blogger and photographer in Sydney, Australia under the alias @kerabeareats. Follow her delectable food photography on Instagram.

Other members of the team, producer, Léah McVeagh, actress, Angie Darby, and Executive Producer, Josh Van Den Heever, all reside in Torbay. Léah is a part of a production outfit called Angle3 Pictures, producing dramatic short films. This was their first feature film, and after editing it around their other freelance work in the Auckland film industry and sending it to festivals, they released it online at Christmas time. 
Life on the Edge February 2019 Celebrate Connecting with our Seas



In the garden in February

Continue to dead-head roses and other flowers and pick fruit regularly to encourage late fruiting. For prolongued dry conditions soak the soil around plants well 2-3 times a week rather than a brief daily sprinkle. Plant late summer crops of lettuce and herbs and prepare germinating trays for winter vegetable seeks like cabbage, cauliflower and broccoli. Annual winter flower seed such as poppies, pansies, primula, cineraria and snapdragon may also be sown. Fertilise your citrus for best results in winter.



Bays Local Board Update

\$30,000 of grants awarded

In December, \$30,000 was awarded in the first round of the Board's small grants funding. Some local groups receiving funding were the Awatuna Sea Scouts and local sporting groups such as the ECB Cricket Club.

Three further grant rounds are coming up:

Local grants (\$2,000 - \$10,000) — opens 3 February, closes 13 March

Multi-board grants – opened 20 January, closes 13 March Small grants (\$200 -\$2,000) – opens 6 April, closes 1 May

Update: Glenvar and East Coast Roads project

In November, Auckland Transport (AT) consulted on their proposed plans for this project and a whopping 450 submissions were received. AT will publish a feedback report soon and will respond to questions that people raised. AT will then submit a proposal to the New Zealand Transport Authority. The funding for this project has



already been earmarked thanks to the significant pressure and public campaign the community got behind.

The Local Board will also be providing feedback. We will both be strongly advocating for an earlier start date as part of that feedback. AT had advertised a start date of early 2020 which has since been pushed out to 2022.

Every summer, especially over the Christmas period, we hear of the tragedy of people drowning.

New Zealand has one of the highest fatal drowning rates in the OECD. The 2019 provisional annual fatal drowning report indicates there were 78



preventable deaths. Each one leaves families and communities devastated.

About 1/3 of childhood drownings were in swimming pools.

So what can we do to stop these deaths?

Most are just sound common sense.

- Make sure everyone in your family can swim.
- Never leave a child unattended in a pool or bath.
- When swimming in the sea swim between the flags on a patrolled beach.
- If not confident wear a life jacket.
- If you get caught in a rip try to swim parallel to the shore until you are able to be free.
- · Alcohol and water are not a good mix.
- Always wear a life jacket on a boat.





Market Pulse on the Shore

Poised for an Active Season



After a delayed start last spring, the property market ended 2019 on 4 year high.

The low number of listings tilted the market in favour of sellers during November, which meant that buyers were in competition mode. There was a significant price increase that carried on through to the very last sales.

Most properties listed during this time sold, leaving a shortage on entering the next peak in February and March. It is clear that buyers will come back from their break on a mission!

For those who are thinking of taking advantage later in the year, on the assumption that prices will keep rising – act wisely. Historically, the market goes into hiatus before an election.

The resurgence of buyer interest started at the bottom of the ladder, with first time buyers cashing their matured Kiwisavers with low interest loans. There was a window of opportunity for them to purchase ex-rental properties.

Torbay Pharmacy: Diabetes and Christmas Eating Excesses: The Aniticote Family friends food and dripk are all a great part of the festive season. The

Family, friends, food and drink are all a great part of the festive season. The sharing of meals is at the centre of many of our social gatherings. It is great for our overall well-being if we bring it back into balance. I would argue that the best approach to working off the excess weight that may have accumulated over the holiday season would be a low carbohydrate or even a ketogenic diet.

Low carbohydrate diets have worked very well for many of my patients (and myself).

I have had patients with Type II Diabetes reverse their diabetes and manage to come off all their diabetes medication in consultation with their doctor. There are lots of patients with Type I Diabetes who are achieving very stable blood glucose levels and HBA1c levels (a long-term marker of blood sugar control) by using ketogenic diets. These people use much less insulin too.

What is "Keto"?

Ketogenic diets can also be helpful for weight-loss in healthy people. Most people feel really good when they follow this diet. So, what is a ketogenic diet?

A ketogenic diet is one whereby you change the balance of the macronutrients that you eat, so that you are eating approximately 10% carbohydrates, 20 to 30% protein, and 60 to 70% fat. When you do this, your body switches to burn fat as a fuel source. When your body burns fat as its main fuel source, it produces ketones in your blood (hence the name "keto"). Ketones are a great fuel source for the brain and heart. This is why many people who get into ketosis report greater energy, less aches and pains, and clearer thinking.

Ketogenic diets are used in US Military personnel who must perform at peak levels. They have also been used in medicine for over 70 years. Current research will likely see ketones being used as treatments for many brain conditions.

Is there anyone who shouldn't try a ketogenic diet?

There are some people with genetic deficiencies in enzymes that make ketones, e.g. the HMG CoA Lyase enzyme. If you have a genetic deficiency in that enzyme, then you can't make ketones, so you must ensure a good supply of carbohydrates and protein for survival. People with these deficiencies will know that if they go long periods without eating, or do strenuous exercise, they will get very tired and even go into a coma. Most people are protected by ketones during such circumstances. But these people lack the protection of ketones. However, for most people getting into ketosis is safe if done the right way.



What's the Trick?

You can eat bad food and still get into ketosis. The trick is to create a ketogenic diet of healthy food. We have practitioners at the pharmacy who can help you with this. Try it. It could change your life.



Fishing Report ope everybody had a fishy **February**

Tides Feb 2020 (Murrays Bay)

Christmas and safe boating throughout the festive period.

Bright sunny days can make the fishing a tad challenging, so the early birds or night owls amongst us are probably used to the taste of fresh snapper more than some of us.

With the Hauraki Gulf producing such great snapper fishing from Sept - December, maybe the summertime is a

good option to try targeting another species, like the mighty kingfish!

FISHING DIE

There are four main ways to target them, all of them are based on the fact that big fish eat little fish.

Live-baiting - simply catch small bait fish like a yellowtail, put a big hook in it, then put it back in the water. From here you can either deploy it under a balloon, add a 6oz sinker to it and drift or start your motor and troll around with it (my favourite).

Jigging – drop a 200g+ vertical jig to the bottom and wind it back up as fast as you can - more effectively is to mechanically jig it back to the surface.

Topwater – involves casting a stick-bait or a popper as far from the boat as possible and retrieving it across the surface of the ocean – using a sweeping motion will generally produce better results.

Trolling – dragging a Rapala type lure behind the boat running at approx. 6kts is probably the easiest way to target kingfish and can be hugely successful.

The three artificial methods above are all trying to do what the live-baiting method does faultlessly – imitate a small fish, without having to try and catch one. Other factors to take into consideration are when to fish and where to fish, also, when targeting this extremely hard and fast running fish, you need to be armed accordingly. No use taking a knife to a gun fight or
