Save our shops

The last couple of months have been a difficult time for everyone.

People trying to work from home, children cooped up and businesses closed.

We are now starting out on our "new normal" whatever that is going to mean.

The one thing we do know is that now is the time to support your local businesses. Economists reckon 20-25% of small businesses will fold after the lockdown. We have it in our power to make sure it is none of the shops in Torbay by supporting them as much as possible.

It makes sense too and saves petrol!

Four Square, the Pharmacy, the Dairy and the Doctor's all opened under what were very difficult circumstances. We were all learning a new way of "doing life". Then some businesses were able to operate in a contactless way and that meant huge adjustments and difficulties too. But they tried so that you people who live in this community could be served in the best way possible.

As restrictions are cut back further we will see a return of Hair salons, dentists and Beauty Salons.

These will have been hit very hard as they will have had no way of generating income for best part of three months but still have rents and rates to pay.

We need to get firmly behind all of our shops. We don't want to see empty shops in our Centre where a shop had to close for lack of support.

We were not able to produce a May issue of the magazine as printers were only allowed to print essential items and community magazines do not count as essential.

We have stories in these pages of life in lockdown, many of us will be able to know exactly what that feels like.

The one thing we did learn though was how important community is. People caring for their neighbours. Long Bay Baptist set up a scheme for shopping, pharmacy collections, food parcels, home made soup and telephone trees where many people living on their own were telephoned twice a week to check they were okay.

On page 24 we have a story where our Chinese community were invaluable in helping with the provision of free masks to the doctor's and the pharmacy. They also supplied care workers in the community who had been unable to get any protection.

We all worked together for the common good and our community was the better for it.

y apologies for not being able to attend to your denture needs during Covid-19 Alert Levels 4 and 3. As we are now transitioning into more routine clinical practice, I would like to inform you of our single point-of-contact manufacture process and our strict infection control protocols.

In our clinic you don't have to deal

Method

Place the flour and salt into a large mixing bowl. Make a well in the centre of the flour and pour in the yeast.

Warm the milk and butter until the butter is melted and the mixture lukewarm. Pour into the flour mixture, add the egg and stir thoroughly until the contents of the bowl come together as a soft dough.

Tip the dough onto a lightly floured work surface and knead well for five minutes, until the dough is smooth and elastic.

Place the dough into an oiled bowl and leave to rise, covered with a damp tea towel, for one hour or until doubled in size.

Tip the dough out onto a lightly floured work surface. Roll out dough into a rectangle.

Brush all over with the melted honey. Evenly sprinkle the orange zest over the buttered surface, followed by the sugar, cinnamon and dried fruit. Start to roll the dough into a swiss roll shape. With a sharp knife cut into thick rounds - about 4cm/1¾in.

Grease a deep roasting tin and place the buns, cut side up, into the greased

baking tray leaving about 1cm/½in of space between each one.

Leave to rise for about 30 minutes in a warm place.

Preheat oven to 190C/170C Fan bake and bake for 20-25 minutes until goldenbrown.

Remove the buns from the oven and let them cool on a cooling rack.

Ingredients

500g/1lb 2oz strong white flour, plus extra for dusting

1 tsp salt

1 x 7g sachet fast-acting yeast 300ml/10fl oz milk

40g/1½oz unsalted butter, plus extra for greasing the tin

1 free-range egg

vegetable oil, for greasing

For the filling

25g/1oz unsalted butter, melted
1 orange, zest only, grated
75g/2½oz soft brown sugar
2 tsp ground cinnamon
100g/3½oz dried cranberries
100g/3½oz sultanas

100g/3½oz dried apricots, chopped

To finish

Honey melted in microwave brush over tops

nxiety is a normal human feeling, Awhich happens to us in response to stress or danger.

Everyone gets anxious from time to time - it's what the body does naturally in a stressful situation. This kind of anxiety is a normal part of everyday life.

Usually it only lasts for a few hours or days while the situation which is causing the anxiety is happening.

Covid 19 has brought into people's lives a whole new level of stress.

It has brought anxiety about those who were outside of our bubble, trying to work from home with children home too, whether there would be enough wages coming in to pay the payments going out, whether you would have a job at the end or whether you would catch and die from this virus.

We have all been outside of our comfort zones and this is the time that anxiety will be felt.

Anxiety shows itself in feeling tense and on edge, perhaps a shorter temper than usual You may feel "out of control" or filled with a sense of dread. You may

find it difficult to concentrate, have difficulty sleeping, muscle tension.

If anxiety really builds you can experience trembling, a racing heart, tingling, nausea, sweating and shortness of breath because your body is living in overdrive.

Selfcare is important to help you cope with anxiety. Activity at a moderate level for 30 minutes will help to improve your mood. Swimming and walking also help give a "feel good " factor.

Try to eat sensibly with healthy well balanced meals, more fruit and veg and less processed foods.

Try to indulge in relaxation techniques such as breathing exercises, pilates etc.

Talk about your fears to another person you trust. Remember at the moment we are all in the same boat- you are certainly not the only one feeling the stress.

Try to think positive. Uncertainty is the worst because it allows your mind to develop many stressful senarios. Appreciate the small good things. My reply to cashiers at the supermarket when they ask me if I am having a good day is "Every day I wake up and the bedroom ceiling is above me, is a good



If the feeling of anxiety persists when things start to change again then go and see your GP. It may be that you need some medication to help you over this time or perhaps counselling.

Be convinced that things will get better.

In 1994 The Torbay Business Assoc. produced a 1995 calendar with Bill Ellis's Black & White photos of business owners at the time. The photos with this article were taken in 2 of the shops still existing now.

Alan Ebdale produced the calendar.

He ran the Torbay Fruit shop. His parents, John and Shirley bought the shop about 1980, and Alan took over about 1984. The photo shows Alan with his sister, Susan. Even then the emphasis was on Organic food. At that time the butcher was on the other side of the road.

In 1993 Brian Amrein bought the 'Torbay Vintners" from the previous owner who, because of ill health had to sell up. The shop sold beer, wine and spirits but was also the TAB centre. This was supposed to bring customers to the shop to buy the alcohol products. It didn't quite work out that way so Brian gave the TAB away. Some residents might remember the circumstances around that.

The colour photo shows a later time 2014 but with many changes today. Videos shops are no longer around. The mural on the wall has gone along with the shop.

The rustling sound of paper bags

In the early hours of March 31th, I arrived in Auckland from London Heathrow. I had expected to self-isolate at my parents' house in Long Bay.

Though somehow, fuzzy-brained, sweat-drenched from carrying my cello case with one arm, and (after nearly three years of absence) struggling to re-familiarise myself with the New Zealand accent, I was herded onto a bus together with about 20 of my fellow passengers.

It was an hour before dawn; our bus was travelling in total darkness. About 5 minutes into our journey, the mixture of confusion and fear became too much for me and I half-shouted to my fellow passengers

'Could anyone please tell me where exactly we are going?'

'We don't know either, sorry.' 'We have no idea.' They were sympathetic, a little amused, and not at all worried.

Fortunately, the bus stopped at a hotel after another five minutes, and after a conversation with a lady from the Ministry of Health I gathered that I could not go home.

If I wanted to avoid the risk of infecting my parents, I needed to isolate at the hotel for 14 days. One moment later, I was in an en suite room with a double bed.

Each day, three meals and two snacks in



paper bags were delivered punctually to my room. At 9:30 am every morning I received a call to take my meal orders for the next day. In the early afternoon the nurse knocked on my door to take my temperature and check whether I had developed any symptoms. I was also allowed one daily exercise.

What truly made me wonder, and still puzzles me, was how energetic and cheerful the staff always seemed and sounded--whenever I picked up the phone, whether to order my meals



or to ask for a few more tubes of shampoo and conditioner, I was greeted by different voices that, without exception, sounded as if they were produced by someone smiling, and made me smile too.

If anything, I felt guilty that as someone who eventually turned out to be entirely healthy, I didn't quite deserve the thoughtful and thorough treatment I received. I also wish that I said 'thank you' more loudly each time my foodparcel was delivered, so that I could be sure that they heard it each time.

I am now back home. We all know health professionals worldwide as the frontline fighters in this crisis, though whenever I heard the rustling sound of paper bags or a gentle but firm knock on my door, I was witness to a no less earnest battle.

In the hope that some of these paperbag warriors, or people very much like them, may see this, I end with what I wrote to the catering team, which is a little prayer roughly equivalent to 'kia kaha' that Jewish scribes in medieval Europe often wrote as a scribal formula on the manuscripts they copied: קזחתנו קזח קזח (chazak chazak venitchazak)--'be strong, be strong, and we will all be strengthened.'

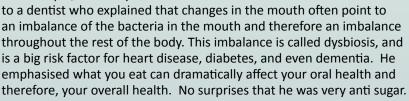

Torbay Pharmacy: Bad Gums is a Risk for Dementia

I hear stories all the time of people who struggle with their health and well-being for years before finally finding a practitioner who helps them. Sometimes that practitioner is another doctor, a specialist, a dentist, naturopath, homeopath, yoga teacher, physical therapist, spiritual guru, psychologist, pharmacist. Each of these practitioners has a different "tool kit". Each can take a slightly different view of you and your health.

I attend lectures from lots of health experts from lots of different backgrounds. The thing they have in common is that they all recommend eating well, moving your body and reducing stress. These are simple but incredibly powerful tools.

For example, I recently listened



I consider this is just one more piece of evidence that suggests we need to eat well. Eating well means lots of veges, some fruit, adequate good quality protein and fats, as well as fibre. "which flowers for at least a month in autumn. I've been cutting it back very severely in winter to stop it from getting too large and leggy. It responds well to pruning, regrows over summer and flowers just as well the following autumn."

Jan Cann shared her experience of "... trying to grow seeds without much luck. My husband is a bit of a hoarder so he made me a seed raising box, using stuff he had round the place. He needed a project and this will have to do until we

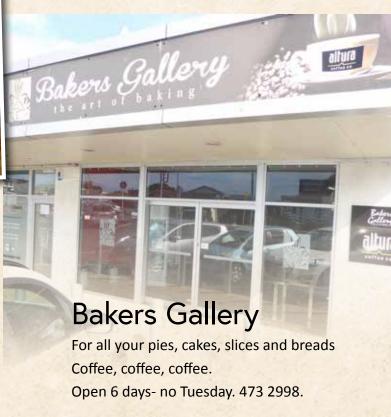

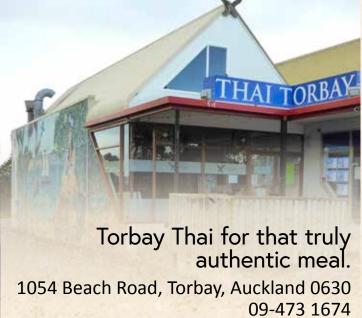

Rates consultation – have your say

Auckland Council is now consulting on its emergency budget post-COVID-19. Your feedback is being sought on a proposed 2.5% or the 3.5% rates increase they had planned prior to the pandemic. There is some support in place now for those experiencing financial hardship and the consultation will seek feedback on further measures.

We've also heard that you want Local Boards to retain their discretionary budgets (which account for less than 2% of Council's overall budget). Following public consultation, Local Boards will have another opportunity to

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INNOVATIVE CULTURE ENSURES QUICK RESPONSE TO ONLINE LEARNING

COVID-19 Alert Levels 3 and 4 brought many challenges, including the need for students to complete their school studies from home. Long Bay College staff pivoted quickly and were well positioned to deliver the curriculum online from the very first day of lockdown.

"Our College is known for its qualities of creativity and care and we really leveraged these values to ensure our students could seamlessly continue to connect with their teachers and keep up with their lessons throughout Alert Levels 3 and 4," says College Principal Mr CJ Healey.

"Staff continued to provide a high standard of care for students. They refined and adopted systems and created innovative ways of delivering a high quality education remotely. We have demonstrated, as a school, we are living our core values with greater strength than ever."

While teachers collaborated across faculties sharing best practise techniques for working remotely, so did students. They supported each other by sharing tips and ideas during online class chat sessions.



"Remote learning has been a whole new experience for many students, staff and parents. Feedback has been extremely positive from all groups and student attendance at online classes was impressively high," says Mr Healey. "The quality of work produced at home has been outstanding."

Microsoft Teams was used by Media Studies students who worked together in small groups to critically analyse films and share their insights video conference: **Physical** Education students performed drills, activities and challenges at home and uploaded videos of their achievements: Dance students also used video to send their teacher selfchoregraphed routines; Wood and Food Technology students utilised home materials and uploaded photos of their projects from



concept to completion. Year 9 French students performed their French play assessment through Microsoft Teams' Chat. And in English, the school utilised Microsoft 365 and YouTube to allow every student to digitally submit their annual speech. A number of co-curricular activities continued online while new

"We have a passionate sustainability group who continued to meet and develop their initiatives remotely; a Dungeons and Dragons group now meets regularly using Microsoft Teams and a songwriter's group and a book club started online during lockdown," says Mr Healey.

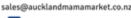

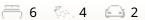
