# Adele Graves

## 100 Fabulous Years Old

n 14 February 2020 we will be celebrating the 100th birthday of Adele Graves, World War Two Veteran.

Adele served in the Women's Auxiliary Air Force from 1940 to 1945 and was based at sites at Oxford, Blackpool and Northolt.

As a WAAF, Adele worked with a team of other women repairing aircraft after they returned to site with damage.

Adele described this role as needing to climb high on ladders and working with other women pulling material tightly over the damage and then coating the area with what she called "dope" which sounded like a very thick paint. The lead content must have been quite high in the dope as the workers were required to drink 2 pints of milk a day - needless to say, Adele said that she needed to change her uniform size at least once! Adele still has some of the material which was used to cover the aircraft.

Adele was born in Twickenham, England on 14 February 1920. Weighing only 2lb 2oz when she was born, Adele was cast aside by the midwife who didn't think she would survive! At 100 years old Adele has definitely proved the midwife wrong!

Adele's childhood was spent in London and Belgium. One of





the schools Adele attended was a German School and as such during her early years Adele was able to speak fluent German, French and English.

Adele met her future husband, Robert, during the early years of the war while sheltering in the underground during an air raid.

Adele and Robert married on 2 April 1945 during one of Robert's brief days off in England.

Robert flew for the Royal Air Force as a radio operator.

Following their demob, Robert and Adele developed their own butchery businesses which they continued with until

1964 when they sold up and travelled initially to Australia and then New Zealand.

Adele has two daughters, two granddaughters and 2 great grandchildren all living close by and all enjoying the time they spend with Adele.



#### Steps to Successfully Grow a Windowsill Herb Garden

Int, rosemary, basil, oregano, chives, parsley, and thyme all grow especially well on a windowsill, and you'll likely use these most in the kitchen. If there's another herb you love and cook with regularly, you should feel free to try planting

Make sure you have a sunny windowsill, where your herbs will survive. A south or southwest window would be perfect if it gets at least 6 hours of sun per day and is away from drafts. If you don't have a reliably sunny window, you will need to provide some type of plant lighting. Lack of enough sunshine will leave you with spindly, stressed plants, with little flavor

Choose herbs that don't grow too wide or tall.

Chives, basil, lavender, parsley, mint, rosemary and thyme are good choices.

Snip and use your plants often to encourage them to grow full and bushy. Once the plants are at least 6 inches tall, don't be afraid to use your herbs. The more you snip, the bushier they'll become.

Never trim more than 1/3 of the plant's foliage. Pruning more than that can stress the plant and cause it to start to decline.

Start seeds of new plants to replace the ones you are using. No plant lives forever and many herbs, like basil and dill, are



actually annual plants that will try to go to seed within 4 - 6 months. Don't fight it, just replace them with new, vigorous plants, the way you would in an outdoor garden.

Use a soilless potting mix to avoid soil born diseases. Be sure the mix is light and will be well draining. Don't try to use soil from the garden. Regular soil compresses over time, making it difficult for water to pass through

Water herb plants sparingly. Herbs don't like to sit in wet soil. Drain the saucers, when excess water accumulates. Test to see if the containers need water by poking your finger into the soil. If it feels dry an inch or two below the surface, it's time to water. If not, let them be. Although outdoor plants tend to need more water in the summer, indoor plants can dry out quickly when the heat is on in the winter.

#### What does a changing median mean?

If you've noticed the recent increase in the MEDIAN figure and wonder what that means, it refers to the value of the property halfway up the price ladder of sold properties (or the average of just the middle two values).

#### What can that tell us?

- The main thing the median tells us, is where the midpoint is, between the upper end of value, and the lower end.

An increased median can indicate that buyer confidence is higher, houses are selling for higher prices, more of the higher priced homes have sold; or overall, there are not enough houses on the market to satisfy the number of buyers needing them.

# Foster Hope NZ Proud to be Finalist in 2020 New Zealander of the Year Awards

Poster Hope New Zealand is honoured to be a finalist in the upcoming 2020 New Zealander of the Year Awards. A charity, which was formed on the belief that every child in foster care deserves to know their community cares about them, Foster Hope was nominated in the Mitre 10 Community of the Year Category and has been chosen as one of three finalists, with the winner to be announced later this month.

"Receiving this nomination reflects the incredible support our many volunteers, local businesses, members of the public, social workers and foster families have provided over the past 10 years" Chairperson and Founder of Foster Hope, Louise Allnutt says.

"We realised that many foster children often arrive at new placements with nothing but their clothes on their backs and belongings in a rubbish bag. This is what led to the formation of Foster Hope in 2010.

"Last year alone we provided over 5,200 filled backpacks and 132 flatpacks, we collected 9,500 pairs of pyjamas and our

in over 6,600 hours of work", Mrs Allnutt says.


Over 6,000 children are in foster care in New Zealand.

The partially developed Ashley Avenue sports fields were used for a number of seasons when the club lost land to developments on Ralph Eagles Place and the forming of the roundabout for Long Bay College.

With the advent of further developments and the future plans for Glenvar Ridge Road, the introduction of new groups of eager youngsters into the club became problematic and Jill was reluctantly forced to close the club in 2004.

Jill and her friends continue to ride locally and she looks back fondly on the club days as friends were made and young riders became proficient riders. She sees now how these memories reflect the changing land use in the Long Bay area.

The year 2020 is not an ordinary year to all of us.

On the first day of 2020, our family happily landed in China to celebrate Chinese New Year. No one realised that an unknown virus was spreading in a silence. We had no other choice but to stay at home to protect ourselves as well as other people during the time that coronavirus exploded.

It was a very difficult week for us before we embarked on our journey back to Auckland, on the last day of January, and we had no idea what we would be faced with. We kept wearing masks all the time during our trip as well as on the way back to our house. My five year old daughter and I immediately started a 14 day isolation - apart from my husband who did not travel with us. After one week of self-isolation, my parents safely landed

and the first thing we did was register them through the healthline according to the updated requirements of the Ministry of Health.

To be honest, two weeks (it is going to be three weeks for my daughter and I) is a long time as we are not supposed to do any regular activities - which includes grocery shopping and schooling. But we believe that we are doing the right thing to protect our health as well as the health of our family, friends and our wider community.

This is a tragedy. But this will be defeated successfully with all the people's love, care and great efforts.

May God's mercy be with Wuhan people, Chinese and New Zealand people.





# In the garden in March

It's time to plan and prepare your autumn and winter garden. Autumn is nature's planting time as the ground is still warm and the first of the rain helps new plants. Prepare flower beds with compost, lime and fertilizer. Cut back perennials and plant new ones. Feed ornamental trees and shrubs. Autumn is the best time to sow or repair your lawn to rejuvenate over winter. Plant seedlings of cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, beetroot, brussell sprouts, spinach, silverbeet and winter herbs. They will also need protection against slugs and snails. Feed citrus well to maintain growth and fruit. As the season moves into autumn daffodils can be planted in full sun with well-drained soil. Anemones and Racunculus will benefit if the bulbs are chilled for 5-6 weeks in the fridge then soaked for 6-7 hours before planting. Sow sweet peas next to a sunny fence. Harvest pumpkins in late summer and leave them in an open sunny position to dry out before storing.

pillbox is a type of blockhouse, or concrete dug-in guard post, normally equipped with loopholes through which to fire weapons. It is in effect a trench firing step hardened to protect against small-arms fire and grenades and raised to improve the field of fire.

These were erected at strategic points during the war to enables large guns to observe the Gulf without being seen themselves.

The Germans invented these concrete bunkers and the British soldiers called them pill boxes as the shape was the same as Pharmacists used to dispense pills.

We have three in Torbay.

One is accessed at the far end of Long Bay Beach by walking up over the headland.

The second is able to be seen when you walk through the Oneroa Track from the end of Gilberts Place down onto the beach by the Merc Building.

The third one is easy to see as it is on Beach Road when it curves around to go down to the MERC building.
