Okura Forest Festival Saturday 18 February 2023

From small beginnings 10 years ago, where local musicians came to play at the Okura Domain to entertain the locals and raise funds for Friends of Okura Bush, grew the well-loved annual Okura Forest Festival. Today, the Okura Forest Festival is Auckland's largest one-day environmental awareness music festival – a 12-hour event run entirely by volunteers. The last one attracted over 1500 people!

It is a very family-friendly event with a range of child-orientated activities, some a little quirky. But all ages attend from the very young to seniors. Feedback from previous festivals include such comments as 'best one-day festival ever'.

The event runs from 11am to 11pm at the Okura Domain, 89 Okura River Road. Cost of entry has had to be increased next year to \$49 for an all-day ticket to cover increased costs to

Bands include local and headline acts. In February, one group, Ungus, is coming from Australia!

Well-being and craft stalls add to the festive feel, as do stalls from community or Council environmentally focused groups such as Zero Waste, Whitebait Connection, Live Lightly, Kauri Dieback and Greenpeace.

There are also one-hour workshops facilitated by experts in the environmental field. These are very popular, with up to 100 attending the main sessions in the hall, and they're free for Festival attendees.

Although those coming to the Festival often bring their own picnics, a large team of volunteers prepare a range of delicious, mainly vegan and, where possible, organic food and beverages for sale.

Proceeds from the Festival are targeted towards the environmental restoration programmes undertaken by Friends of Okura Bush in the Okura – Weiti – Stillwater area, including trapping, weed control and planting programmes.



Cancelled Buses

It's no surprise that Auckland Transport has been in the news recently for its spate of bus cancellations. But why are these buses being cancelled?

I, being a non-driving school student, rely on buses a lot. Checking AT's mobile app to see the changes to the schedule in the afternoon, recently only brings bad news. If my usual bus home is cancelled, I have to wait 30 to 45 minutes for the next bus.

More than 1000 buses are being cancelled each day! This is because Auckland Transport and its operators are more than 500 drivers short of their minimum 2500 staff requirement. Of those that are employed, on any one day about 10% of them are off sick.

Long shifts – some being 14 hours long, coupled with low pay and the ever-increasing risk of assault are putting people off the job.

Auckland Transport acknowledges it is an issue, however, according to Public Transport Users Association National Coordinator Jon Reeves, buses not turning up is a major turn-off. Reportedly many commuters have reverted to driving instead of catching the bus.





To fix the driver shortage, Auckland Council, and Auckland Transport with Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Agency have committed funding to increase bus drivers' pay. The former has committed an 8% increase in wages, and, together, the latter will add 3.9% on top of that. Minister for Transport, Hon. Michael Wood, also announced that the Government will commit \$61 million for drivers' wages


to increase base rates in main transport centres to \$30 per hour and \$28 per hour for regional drivers. Some of this money is earmarked for fixing the conditions in which bus drivers work.

Hopefully, the wage increases will help to retain drivers, attract more drivers to the job and result in less cancellations before more commuters lose faith in public transport.

Sustainability is an important value to many people who live in the upper East Coast Bays area.

Throughout the year the paper we print on and the quality of printing has changed a few times. This is because the printing cost was high when the new Torbay Magazine editorial team started in February. Gardening with Veronika

Summer means you can now grow climbing beans, dwarf beans, cucumbers, tomatoes, capsicums, aubergines, chilli plants, squash,

zucchini, corn and melons. They all love the warmer weather.

If some of your plants are going to seed. Let them go! Their flowers will help feed beneficial insects. And, left in the ground long enough, the seeds will drop and could sprout, supplying you with free growth for the next season.

Tips for Growing Healthy Tomato Plants

- First, prep your soil with compost, sheep pellets and a full spectrum mineral fertilizer.
- To prevent blossom end rot, which is a calcium deficiency in tomatoes, put crushed eggshells in the hole you're going to plant in. You can also put banana skins in, as tomato plants love potassium.
- For support, insert a stake and tie the plant to it with a soft fabric tie.
- Remove the lower leaves and plant deep as roots will develop along the buried stem and make a strong and sturdy plant.
- Water it well. Tomatoes are best watered earlier in the day and directly onto the soil to prevent any dampness staying on the plant which can lead to fungal disease.
- Add a layer of mulch around the base of the plant but not directly against the stem.
- Basil, Marigolds, Borage and Phacelia are great companion plants for tomatoes.



Mulch and Living Mulch

If you're going away on holiday, add a good layer of mulch around your veggies to help stop the soil from drying out. Bare soil means dry soil as it is getting warmer. To prevent this add hay, straw, rotted woodchip, pea straw, grass clippings or simply old plant material from around your veggie patch. Also, a living mulch will leave no room for weeds to grow or birds or cats scratching in your garden.



MARINE RESERVE OFFENCES ARE PROSECUTABLE...

and can result in a fine of up to \$250,000 or up to 3 months imprisonment?

That's a hefty penalty – but deterrents are needed to protect our precious Marine Reserves.

You too can help...

If you see someone who might be about to commit an offence, such as carrying fishing gear, let them know they're in a Marine Reserve. They might be unaware of the boundaries or what behaviours are prohibited.

A polite reminder might be all it takes to prevent an offence being committed. Phone 0800 DOC HOT for the Department of Conservation and let them know you've intervened.

If you see someone actually fishing or collecting shellfish – do not engage. Engaging can undermine a compliance investigation. Be careful, remain safe and call 0800 DOC HOT immediately. DOC have trained staff or honorary officers who may be available to investigate.

If it's safe,

take photos from a distance.
Include landmarks to help with establishing the location of the offence. The number plate of a vehicle involved can also be helpful. From there, leave it in DOC's hands. They have legal responsibility – your job is done.

A Kayak Fisher's Gift List

Christmas gifts for a kayak fisher can be tricky. While we can never have too many rods and reels, we tend to choose particular set-ups for our style of fishing.

So, unless you know exactly what the yak fisher in your life wants, it's probably better to leave rods off the list. However, there are many other options to suit a range of budgets.

Fishfinder: A high-end item, but it can be a game changer for people who fish often. While we call them fishfinders, their greatest advantage is being able to 'look beneath the water', find structure where fish are likely to frequent and getting in close to reefs without losing your tackle to the rocks below.

Hot water bottle: This is a quirky, its 'the thought that counts' gift. Filled with icy cold water it helps keep caught

fish cool in the back of the kayak. It takes up less space than most cooling options and doesn't clunk about.

Kayak Gaff: Like a normal gaff but shorter – perfect for hauling large fish onto your kayak or for species with a very soft mouth that are likely to come off the line if allowed to fight too much.

Lures: Kaveman Tackle Micro jigs – either singles or a box set. Pretty shiny things that appeal to pretty much any species. Or a gift voucher for tackle.

Rod Rack: (pictured)

As the rod collection grows, so does the need for organisation.



Make a Christmas Gift Bag

- 1. Gather your tools and materials: a supermarket brown paper bag, 2 different patterned Christmas wrapping paper, a piece of card 6cm x 11cm, ribbon, scissors, glue and a ruler.
- 2. Measure 2 strips of wrapping paper to the width of the bag x 3 cm deep and glue one to the top half of the bag 5cm from the top.
- 3. Measure 1 strip from the second piece of wrapping paper to the width of the bag x 11 cm deep and glue this close to the first strip.
- 4. Glue the second narrow strip under the deep strip.
- 5. Cut a small motif from one of the papers and glue on the bottom corner of the bag.
- 6. Cut several lengths of ribbon and knot onto one of the handles.
- 7. To make the tag, punch a hole in the centre at the top and add a ribbon.
- 8. Cut strips of the wrapping paper or motifs and decorate the tag.

Meet the Sea Star - Papatangaroa

Did you know there are six sea star species we commonly encounter on the shore here in Long Bay? This month, we're shining a spotlight on the ambush star, Stegnaster inflatus (sometimes referred to as the bat star). Ambush stars have a distinctive 'webbing' between their arms, and they come in various colours; hues of orange, yellow, pink, and even green!

To catch their food, some sea stars use the suction of their tube feet to pry open the shells of prey items like bivalves, but not the ambush stars! They take a different, perhaps more strategic approach, forming a 'cave-like' space below them by arching their body. When

their prey of choice -shrimps, crabs or small fish-think they've found a good spot to hide and takes up shelter beneath it, the ambush star drops onto it. The trapped prey has no way out then - and if it doesn't fit in its mouth, no worries, sea stars can digest their prey outside their

Isn't nature amazing? Always remember that the environment is an intricately connected network, and each organism (no matter how small) plays a unique role in a balanced ecosystem.

Plunketline Open During Holidays

Sleep, sickness, starting solids: there's always something going on when you're looking after kids – and they don't take a break over Christmas. PlunketLine, Whānau Āwhina, Plunket's free 24/7 parent helpline, doesn't stop either. And you don't need to be a Whānau Āwhina Plunket client to use PlunketLine. Anyone with questions or worries about tamariki under 5yrs can call the PlunketLine team any time even on Christmas Day. They even have nurses who can speak languages other than English and Māori, and if needed external interpreters can also be called upon. People with varying levels of deafness are helped via a deaf relay service.

"Our nurses work one of four shifts each day, similar to the model found in hospitals. This shift based roster along with the tele-health model allows *PlunketLine* to operate 24/7 and help whānau around the motu whenever they need it."

This year, the PlunketLine team has handled nearly 99,000 calls and completed more than 1300 breastfeeding video conferences to help families needing support from a lactation consultant. That's an average of 271 calls a day.

"No parent would be surprised to learn that the most common calls to *PlunketLine* relate to sleep – particularly how to get pēpi and tamariki to snooze," says PlunketLine Manager Ms Dick. "Other common queries are around feeding, such as starting solids and how to progress at

different ages, and child behaviour, including dealing with tantrums and toilet training." And when children get ill PlunketLine is there, too. "It can be frightening when your child is ill,

especially in the middle of the night, and parents and caregivers are often very stressed and worried when they call. A nurse will ask their caller questions to find out the symptoms, then direct the parent or caregiver to the best option – that could be advice or a referral to a health centre or even hospital."
