Lest We Forget – Local Story

In the heart of Torbay, resides a distinguished gentleman, Murray Watene (Ngāti Kahungunu). I had the absolute pleasure of interviewing

Murray for this ANZAC Local Story.

Born in 1938, in the small village of Waimārama, Hawkes Bay, on the East Coast, Murray is the second eldest of eight children. At the age of 21, he joined the Police Force. Roughly a year later he joined the Army to serve in Malaya as a noncommissioned officer in the 28th Commonwealth Infantry Brigade Group. He was Section Commander of a brigade tasked with patrolling the border between Thailand and Malaya.

While abroad, Murray met Carol, the daughter of a British Senior Officer. They would later wed in Malaya before returning home to New Zealand to start their family.

A tour in Vietnam and two more trips to Singapore would

ensue. Then in 1980 Murray was posted to the Defense Travel Centre on Queen Street, Auckland where he worked until leaving the Army in 1984. He then joined the Courts where he worked as a Bailiff and as a widely respected Periodic Detention Warden for 13 years.

For the past 14 years, Murray has been reciting the Auckland Museum Memorial Service "Ode Of Remembrance" and he will be performing this honour again at this years' service as he has no intention of "pushing up pūhā" anytime soon. Murray would love to see more people, especially younger generations attend. ANZAC Day gives us the opportunity to remember and honour our war veterans, to share their stories, learn from their wisdom and express our gratitude for their bravery and dedication. Thank you, tēnā rawa atu koe Murray for sharing your story.





Since then she has joined us in a staged reading of *The Importance of Being Earnest,* as the delectable Cecily, and is now back for a second round of "Best-of" Gilbert and Sullivan, cunningly woven into a second highly entertaining show by Peter Segrove.


Like most of the cast, Henrietta is borrowed from the world of professional singing. When not on stage with us, she sings for NZ Opera in the chorus. The Time is Right, the Wind is Not



By Nathan Pont

You've worked all week looking forward to a spot of weekend fishing and as the day dawns the wind sneaks over 15 knots. Of course, safety is the number one priority. If you don't feel comfortable going out or your boat isn't ocean-ready, then plan for another day.

Here's how to look on the Windy app for sheltered conditions.

Windy Forecast for the 19th to 25th March

Using the forecast for 19-25 March, let's say you could only fish on Tuesday afternoon. The conditions are forecast to be southerly winds 15 to 20+ knots with a 3:30pm hightide.

The critical thing is getting wind with tide and finding protection from the wind. Areas I would look at would be along the north side of Whangaparaoa and launching at Stanmore Bay, Little Manly or Army Bay for example. These are all beach launches (see my February article for tips). The other option would be launching within Mahurangi Harbour, such as at Waiwera. Be aware though, these areas are tidal

and can become challenging at low tide.

Next, I would time launching the boat on the tides. The ideal time to launch would be around 1-2pm and getting in position by 3pm to fish the outgoing tide.

Then I would use the charts on the fish finder or Navionics to find reefs or depth changes to fish into. Since the wind is higher, it is likely that drift fishing would be too difficult so I would concentrate on anchoring and bait and berley.

As it is a southerly wind with an outgoing tide, I would recommend being on the southern side of any spot which you would be fishing so the back of the boat will be upwind and up current of the reef meaning you will be attracting fish out of the reef.

I have done the above many times and while the fish may have been smaller than in deeper waters it has always been enjoyable to get out fishing.

This method can work in Southerly, Northerly and Westerly winds - it's just that the location of fishing changes and you have to fish different tides. The critical factors stay the same: What's the direction of wind? When is it wind with tide? Where can I launch the boat and be sheltered while fishing?



Our weekly East Coast Bays coffee group meets every Thursday morning from 10am at our Plunket Family Centre at 8 Constellation Drive. This is open to everyone with a new baby under the age of about 12 months. It's a great way to meet and connect with other mums and make new friends.

We also run local walking groups at various locations on the North Shore, including walks along Long Bay Beach. This is a

great way to get some exercise and another way to meet other mums. Join our Facebook group (North Shore Plunket Walking Group) to find out about our walking groups.

Once your baby is a bit older and more mobile, we suggest taking them to a local Playgroup. The Plunket Cheeky Monkeys playgroup boasts the best sandpit ever. 


proud she felt to have created jobs and businesses for so many people and to have invented practices, processes, and ethical changes that became standard in the insurance industry.
